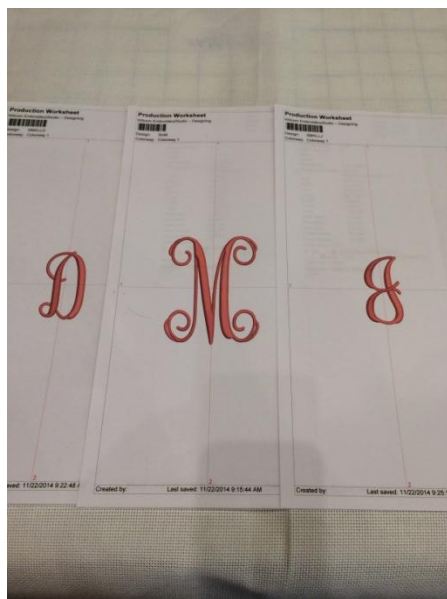


How to use the 3 inch Interlocking Monogram Font

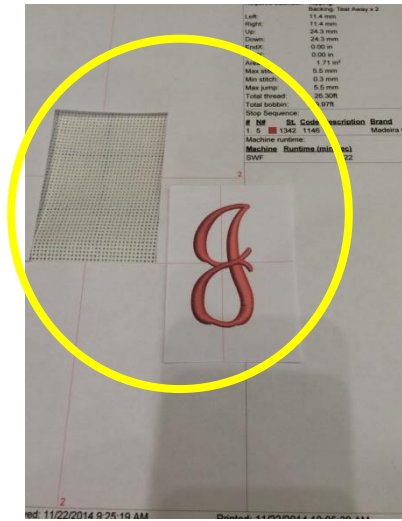
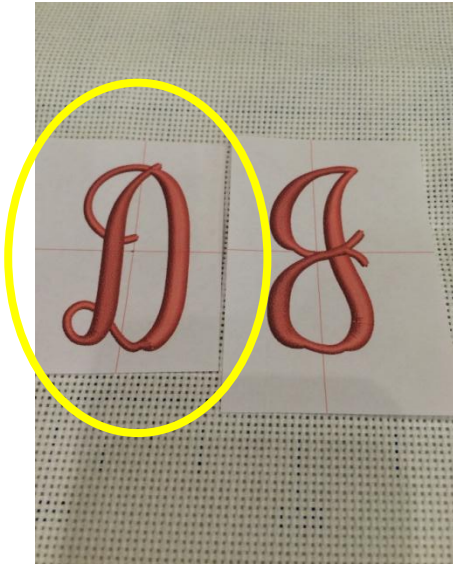
(Note: These **ARE NOT** keyboard fonts. To create a 3 letter font you need to send these to your machine to sew out 1 at a time or have software which allows you to group separate designs)

This font was created with an edge stitch and zigzag underlay, which makes it perfect for all your monogram projects with or without a nap. If you are using on a towel use woven water soluble stabilizer over the top of the nap and it will hold down the loops and dissolve away when done. Or you can use fine tulle the same color as the towel and tear away when done.

- 1) Print out your 3 letters. Middle letter is the 3" (last name initial) right letter is the 1.90" (middle name initial) and left letter is the 1.90" (first name initial). I am using mine as an example. D to the left (looking at the letters), M is the middle and J is the right.

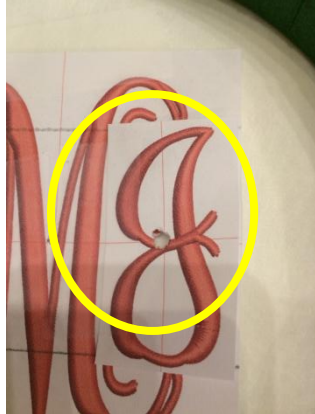
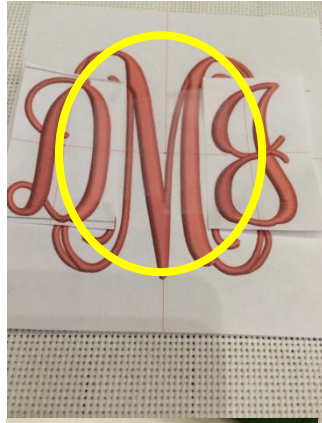


2) Cut out around the letters making sure you have printed the cross



hair on the copy.

3) Tape the letters where you would like the placement. Make sure all your lines on the template match across. I like the smaller letters to be $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the middle letter on each side. Take small scissors, seam ripper, something with a point and stick in the middle of your cross hairs on all three letters.



This will leave a hole big enough to place a mark on the item you are going to Monogram.

- 4) Take an air disappearing pen or washable marker to mark the inside of the holes you just made in your template. Place a dot inside each of the 3 holes after you have hooped your item to monogram. You need to make sure you can see the dots when you remove your template.



5) Attach your hoop to your machine. I prefer to sew the small letters first as I like the swirls on the bigger letter to go over the top of the smaller letters. This is my preference. Since you have marked the circle on your item already you do not need the template. I am showing this as a reference. Make sure you TRACE, TRACE TRACE before sewing. Do each small letter on the right and left first and the bigger letter last. You can see where I have the last remaining mark.

This is the finished monogram. The one on the right is the middle letter sewn last and you can see how the swirl is over the smaller letter. The one on the left is the middle letter sewn first.
